### Prof. Takafumi Sugiyama

2006-present Professor, Hokkaido University, Japan 1997-2006 Associate Professor, Gunma University, Japan 1994-1997 Assistant Professor, Gunma University, Japan



Prof. Sugiyama is a Professor at Advanced Social System Group, Division of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering, Hokkaido University. He obtained Ph.D from the University of New Brunswick in 1994. His research interests are in supplementary cementitious materials, durability of structural concrete, and quality assessment of cement-based materials. Especially, he is focusing on development and application of high-quality X-ray technique for cement science and concrete technology. He is a currently director of Japan Concrete Institute (JCI), and a past Technical Board Chairman in the Asian Concrete Federation (ACF). He has been presented with many awards such as the Japan Concrete Institute Award (Best Paper Award) in 2006 and 2014.

Prof. Michael Angelo B. Prommentilla is a professor of Chemical Engineering and the head of the Waste and Resource Management Unit of the Center for Engineering and Sustainable Development Research (CESDR) at De La Salle University. He received his Ph.D. degree in socio-environmental engineering from Hokkaido University in 2006. He was recognized in 2013 as one of the Outstanding Young Scientists in the field of socio-environmental engineering by the Philippine National Academy of Science and Technology (NAST). Recently, he is the recipient of multiple scientific awards from the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), National Research Council of the Philippines and the Japan Concrete Institute. He is actively involved in mentoring young researches and the founding Head of the Geopolymer and Advanced Materials Engineering Research for Sustainability Lab situated at De La Salle University.
